SPORT SCIENCE

Year 11 Sport Science have had a tricky start to the year, learning all about biomechanics in sport.

They have been gaining an understanding of how to analyse the movement of the body in different sports including the functions and movements possible through different planes and axes.

The students have also been learning all about the lever

systems in the body and In this picture, using golf as an example, the students are investigating the distance from the club head to the ball when different clubs are selected.

The students worked out that the longer the club (resistance arm), the more distance the club head travels which, in turn, generates more speed and therefore more force through the ball.

Fingers crossed from some "stickability" with this topic.
