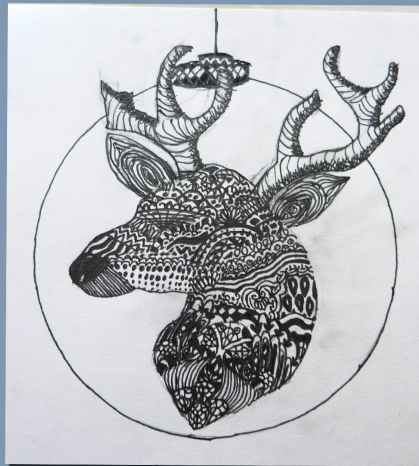




Year 8 Art have been busy working on their Clay Figure Projects.

## Belsen 75 Educational Programme



On April 15th 1945 British troops of the 11th Armoured Division liberated the Nazi concentration camp Bergen-Belsen. Sixth Form students from HCC have been invited to join a unique commemorative initiative in 2020 to mark the 75th anniversary of the liberation and be part of this important national moment.

Students were asked to write a short piece about the initiative and after an excellent field of applicants were considered, Mr Smith and Mrs Anderson were delighted to announce that Ruth Hayhoe (12PGU)

and Emily Burroughs (12ATA) will be representing the College on this programme.

The students will attend a series of pre and post visit seminars and will fly to the camp for the day at the end of February. They will also deliver a presentation about their experiences to lower year History Groups as well as some local community groups.

It is run in partnership with Gallagher and will engage thousands of participants per year across the country. It is delivered by community staff from Exeter Chiefs and the first sessions throughout the day on Tuesday were well received by both staff and students. In addition to PE lessons there are sessions running on Tuesday lunchtime for boys and Tuesday after College (3-4pm) for girls. The aim is to provide accessible opportunities for people to participate in the game at a time and place that can be easily accessed by young people.*
